

Anyone

Victims are forced to provide labor or commercial sex, and can be:

- U.S. citizens or foreign nationals
- Men, women, or children

TOP 3 CALLERS TO THE HOTLINE

- Community Members
- Victims of Trafficking
- Family Members of Victims

WHERE DOES HUMAN TRAFFICKING HAPPEN?

Anywhere & Everywhere

Human trafficking can happen in many situations, including in:

- Commercial sex industry (street prostitution, strip clubs, massage parlors, escort services, brothels, internet)
- Factories (industrial, garment, meat-packing)
- Farms, landscaping, or construction
- Peddling rings, begging rings, or magazine crews
- Private homes (housekeepers, nannies, or servile marriages)
- Restaurants, bars, and other service industries (nail or hair salons)

SIGNS TO LOOK FOR

Not all-encompassing!

If you or someone you know is being forced to engage in any activity and cannot leave, whether it is:

- Commercial sex (street prostitution, strip clubs, massage parlors, escort services, brothels, internet)
- Housework
- Landscaping, construction, or farm work or
- Any other kind of forced labor
- Had their passport or identification taken away or
- Is being threatened with deportation if they won't work
